HEALTH REPORT

This fall a Flu epidemic passed through Haiti. It affected 14 of our 22 children. They were treated with over the counter cold & flu drugs.

Angela and **Guenson** have been experiencing earaches. They will be taken to the Clinique Orlo in December for care.

Zachary has been sick all month. He has been suffering from insomnia, depression, diarrhea, vomiting, lack of appetite resulting in loss of weight. He was unable to attend his second vocational training class. A letter was sent to Mme Arnoux requesting a re-test of Zachary's CD4 count and viral load. The results of the viral load will be available on December 9th.

Although her health has been primarily stable, **Rose-Michelle** has had a cold. She has been given OVC medications, but still the cold prevails. In addition, Rose-Michelle has irritated skin that needs a dermatologist's attention. She will be taken to Femmes Pereo, a private clinic, for care.

Jennifer had her CD4 done and the results are pending. **Gerline** was scheduled for a chest x-ray and

sputum test because of her constant cough and fever. However, the test results were negative for Tuberculosis!

Valentina had an allergic reaction that resulted in a bad skin rash. She was given antihistamine and the issue was resolved in a few days.

Lil' Ruth experienced dental issues that left her face swollen. She had difficulty eating and is in dire need of teeth cleaning and extractions. She was forced to stay home from school several days because of the pain.

Guenson is in need of an operation because the tendons in his left leg are too short. According to the PT, if the operation is not done soon, the damage could be permanent.

Venise has not been feeling well. Overall, she seems overwhelmed and depressed. At times she does not eat. She refuses to take her day off, insisting that she has no where else to go.
